Research reveals the profound impact of these connections: schools with strong family engagement before the pandemic saw 39% smaller increases in chronic absenteeism and significantly better academic outcomes compared to those with weaker engagement practices.

Only 25.4% of educators find it easy to connect with families effectively.

Effective parental involvement in education extends far beyond occasional conferences or curriculum nights. When schools create strong partnerships with families, the impact resonates through every aspect of student success. Yet building these vital connections remains a persistent challenge. 


This foundation requires:




Engaging District Families


